# Burn Edge Park




The park situation between Burnside, Loaninghill and Middleton is now called Burn Edge Park - the name chosen by a pupil from Uphall Primary School.

There are many paths and trails in and around Uphall, Ecclesmachan and Broxburn.





# Fun Activity - Science

### Materials:

- A clean plastic bottle, try to use one with smooth sides
- water
- Vegetable Oil (or you could use Mineral or Baby Oil instead)
- Fizzing tablets (such as Alka Seltzer)
- Food Colouring

#### Instructions:

Fill the bottle up about 1/4th (1 quarter) with water.

Pour the vegetable oil in the bottle until is almost full. You may want to use a measuring cup with a spout or a funnel. You may have to wait a couple of minutes for the oil and water to separate.

Add a few drops of your favourite food colouring. Watch as the colour sinks through the oil. Did your drops of colour mix with the water immediately or float in between for a few minutes?

Break your fizzy tablet in half and drop part of it into the bottle. Get ready ... here come the bubbly blobs!

You can even get a flashlight, turn off the lights and drop in another half tablet. This time shine the flashlight through the lava lamp while the blobs are bubbling!

## Purple Poppy - Patterns to knit or crochet

Earlier in this newsletter, there is an article about the Ancre Somme Association Scotland requesting our help to knit or crochet purple poppies. Below are patterns which may help:

### Knitted - Easy ribbed poppy pattern

Colour A - Purple (one ball will make a lot of poppies)

Colour B - Black wool

### Body of Poppy - Using Col A cast on 60 stitches

Rows 1-10: K2, P2 across whole row (for a slightly smaller poppy do 8 rows of rib)

Row 11: knit 2 stitches together across the row (30 stitches)

Row 12: Slip 1 stitch, knit 2 stitches together then pass the slip stitch over... repeat across the whole row (10 stitches) break off yarn with long tail and thread back through remaining stitches and pull tight. Join edges with mattress stitch

### Centre of Poppy - Using B, cast on 16 sts.

Cast off.

Coil into a tight spiral and sew base into the centre.

### Crocheted Poppy Pattern

### **Body of Poppy - Purple**

Centre of Poppy - Black wool

Leaving a length of wool when casting on and off will allow the poppy to be tied to an animal's collar.

Yarn - Any purple and black.

Hook - 3.5mm, but try larger to see the effect.

### **Body of Poppy**

Round 1: Make a magic loop, make 10 dc in the loop and draw tight, join with ss.

Round 1 (alternative): Make a starting chain of 4 ss to for a circle. Make 10 dc in the circle and join with ss to first dc.

Round 2: \*ch1, dc, ch1, 2tr in next st, 3tr in next st, (2tr ch1 tr) in next st, ss in next 2st.rpt from \* around and join ss.

Round 3: \*ch1 3dc in next 2 sts, 2dc in next 5 sts, 3dc in next 2 sts, ss in next 2sts. Rpt from \* around, fasten off

### **Centre of Poppy**

Make a magic loop, 8dc into loop, tighten and fasten off.
